
D Major Scale Guitar 101



Patterns_Some of the shapes that can be formed look vaguely familiar...

As you up the fretboard, the Root Note / Chord changes

This is often referred to as "The CAGED" system

Remember: The notes or pitch of any Major Scale can be found by citing in Solfege (Do, Re, Mi, Fa, Sol, La, Ti Do)

The Scale of D Major consists of \mathbf{D} \mathbb{E} \mathbf{F} # \mathbb{G} A \mathbb{B} \mathbb{C} # D (Octave)

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8

Every Major chord consist of 1 3 5

So, a D Major chord consists of D F# A
